Congressman LoBiondo Visits Oakwood Beach

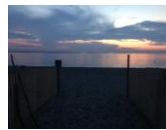
In August, Congressman LoBiondo paid a visit to Elsinboro Township. Mayor Elwell and Deputy Mayor Elk accompanied him on a tour of the Oakwood Beach Project.

Congressman LoBiondo was a part of the Oakwood Beach project from the beginning and was instrumental in ensuring the project was not de-authorized several years ago.

“The people who are going to benefit from this deserve the right to have their homes,

have them protected, and that’s exactly what we’ve done.” Said Congressman LoBiondo during his visit of the area.

During his visit the group discussed ship speeds and ways to address the impact these ships are having. Since that time Congressman LoBiondo’s office has partnered with the mayor and committee to maintain contact with the pilot association and USCG.
